Canadians now need a permit for short-term visits to the United Kingdom

Starting January 8 2025, Canadians with short-term travel plans to England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland will need an electronic travel authorization — or an ETA. Travellers planning to visit the United Kingdom for less than six months will be asked to submit information such as their passport details, dates of travel and modes of transportation, which will be reviewed by authorities. Empowering Youth: International Youth Internship Program (IYIP) prepares for global Impact





Excitement fills the air as our cohort of interns under the <u>International Youth Internship</u> <u>Program (IYIP)</u> gathers for their pre-departure training with McMaster and Empowerment Squared. This program, a partnership between McMaster (led by the OIA) and Empowerment Squared, is set to send 100 Canadian youth aged 18 to 30 on transformative four-month internships to Liberia and Ghana. The first cohort will include nine interns, including 5 McMaster students and alumni, departing to Ghana and Liberia on January 17th to commence their internship.

As part of their internship, the interns completed the Global Citizenship Training Program developed by <u>Dr. Lydia Kapiriri</u>. This program focuses on global citizenship and provides a valuable background to the interns' experiences in Ghana and Liberia. They have also been supported by the <u>Student Success Centre</u> offering them pre-departure training to ensure that they are well prepared for this transformative journey. The training included matters like roles and expectations, McMaster's resources, safety and risk management abroad among many others. <u>The African-Caribbean Faculty Association of McMaster (ACFAM)</u> members will mentor the IYIP interns, providing them with guidance and coaching and encouraging them to progress toward achieving their professional and personal goals.

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Funded by Global Affairs Canada, this initiative aims to provide young Canadians with invaluable international development experience while contributing to meaningful community projects. The internship is part of a larger \$4.9M investment that will run until 2028, offering participants a unique opportunity to develop professional skills and make a global impact.

McMaster and Grenoble International Colloquia

On October 24th, the Office of International Affairs and Université Grenoble Alpes' Outreach Direction (UGA, DRI/DGD DIT) launched the <u>McMaster and Grenoble International Colloquia</u> (<u>MaGIC</u>) initiative. Through a series of virtual colloquia, MaGIC aims to connect faculty and students across both universities working on varied shared topics. Its focus on knowledge exchange, building and maintaining international partnerships, and exploring opportunities for research collaboration and student mobility has positioned MaGIC as a generative new project that honours McMaster and UGA's 40-year history of cooperation.

The first MaGIC session, Materials Science: Metallurgy, brought together presenters Dr. Hatem Zurob (McMaster), Dr. André Phillion (McMaster), Prof. Alexis Deschamps (UGA), PhD student Marion Bregeault (UGA), and post-doc Dr. Bita Pourbahari (McMaster). Over 30 attendees participated across McMaster and UGA, as presentations spoke to the resources available, and work being done, at each university in the field of metallurgy. Open to full time professors, the Faculty Mobility for Partnership Building Program (FMPBP) provides opportunities to do short-term research and teach in Latin America and the Caribbean and the primary objective of the program is to increase, diversify and strengthen institutional collaborations between Canadian post-secondary institutions and their counterparts eligible under the <u>Emerging Leaders in the Americas Program</u> (ELAP). Results are expected to be communicated by the Scholarship Administrator in February 2025.
